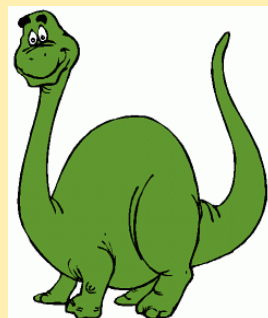

## Gara's Lines & Spaces

I have a devotional book entitled, "Crescendos and Diminuendos." Although it's written mainly for musicians, the spiritual application is for people of all walks of life. The author takes 52 of the most common musical terms and writes about them.

One of my favorites is the word "sostenuto" (sōs-teh-NOO-tōh), which means "sustained, prolonged...sustaining the tone." Sustaining a tone or prolonging its character or duration implies a concentrated effort with a controlled expenditure of energy. For the singer this means an alert mind, committed heart, erect posture with rib cage in a position of elevation, the diaphragm in proper use, the mask of the face slightly lifted, the lower jaw relaxed, and a knowledge of from whence the musical passage has emerged and to where it is going.

This is not easily achieved by most singers. Nor is it perfected without cumulative rehearsal. Not only is the development of the vocal musculature involved but the internal muscular structure of the body must be conditioned as well.

Energy and vitality are involved. The source of both is the human heart. We are told that a "merry heart doeth well like a medicine." This becomes a fact of life for those who really know Christ and who walk in the joyful obedience to His will. If there is joy in the heart then there will usually be energy and vitality in the body.

The presence of God's Holy Spirit in life will be the sustaining source of spiritual strength and energy. This is so important to us as musicians. Seventy-five percent of singing is energy and vitality. As Christians we have ready access to that energy and vitality through prayer. This will sustain us when we are called up to sustain – whether it be in music or a life situation.



### In the Mail:

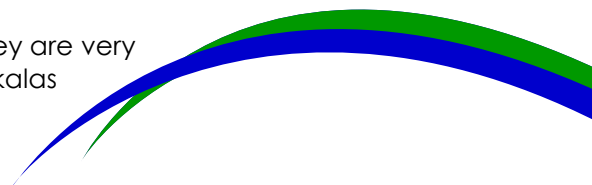

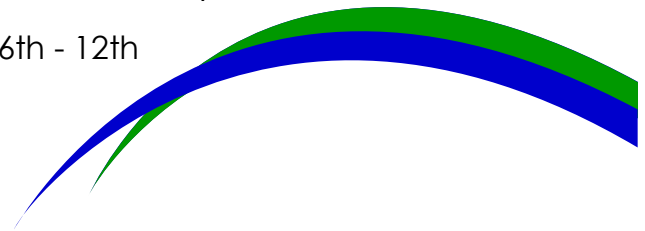


