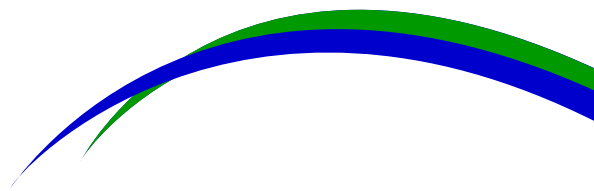
Prayer Quilt Ministry

Composer Spotlight

Fanny Crosby was born Frances Jane Crosby, in 1920 and lived one month shy of her 95th birthday. A lifelong Methodist, she was one of the most prolific hymnists in history, writing over 8,000 hymns despite being blind since infancy. Also known for her public speaking, during her lifetime Fanny Crosby was one of the best known women in the United States. Some of her best known songs include "Blessed Assurance", "Jesus Is Tenderly Calling You Home", "Praise Him, Praise Him", and "To God Be the Glory". Because some publishers were hesitant to have so many hymns by one person in their hymnals, Crosby used nearly 100 different pseudonyms during her career. Another note of interest about Ms. Crosby is that even though she was blind, many of her hymn texts talked about seeing things. She could see so much more in her blindness than we could ever see with our eyes.

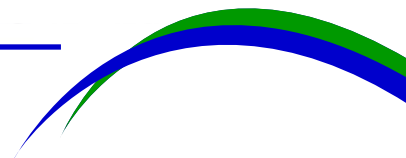
Thank you for your support of our bake sale on Sunday, August 29th. We look forward to our next bake sale on our next Denim Sunday!

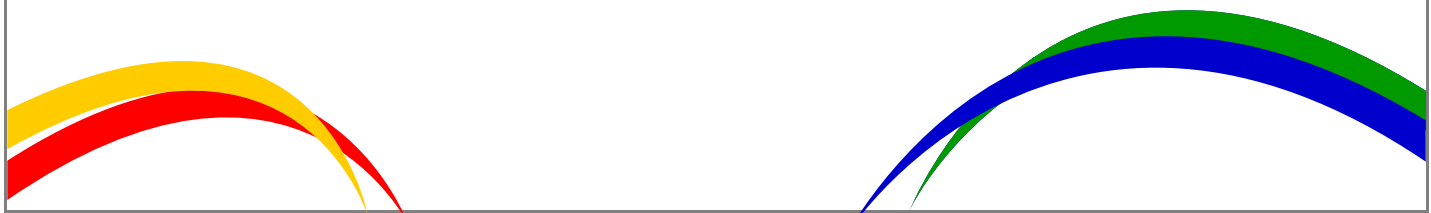

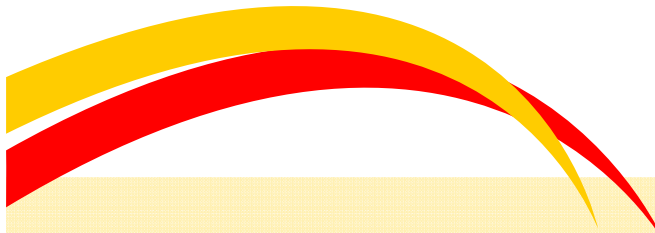
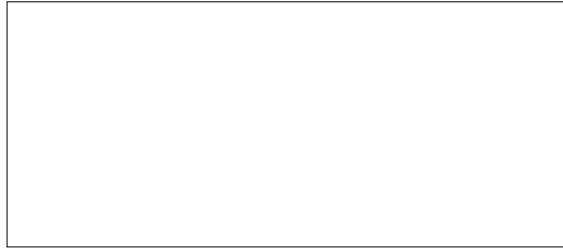
